# **PA Program Goals**

# Kansas State University PA program will:

- 1. Recruit and select a class of highly qualified applicants who successfully complete the program.
- 2. Provide students the knowledge, skills, and competencies required for entry-level clinical practice.
- 3. Prepare students to provide medical care to a diverse patient population.
- 4. Encourage civic responsibility with professional and community involvement.
- 5. Strive for and encourage graduates to obtain their first job in the state of Kansas.
- 6. Prepare graduates to meet or exceed the national first time PANCE pass rate.

## 1. Recruit and select a class of highly qualified applicants who successfully complete the program.

**1.A. Benchmark:** 100% of matriculants will meet the minimum qualifications for enrollment.

- a. **Rationale:** All students should meet the minimum requirements established for the Kansas State PA program admissions.
- b. **Strength**: One hundred percent (100%) of student applicants who are admitted to the Kansas State PA program will meet all admission requirements over a period of three consecutive years.
- c. **Area of improvement**: Less than 100% of student applicants who are admitted to the Kansas State PA program meet all admission requirements over a period of three consecutive years.

**1.B. Benchmark**: The cohort graduation rate will be within 2% of the national average (PAEA annual report).

- a. **Rationale**: The KSU PA program recognizes that our cohorts should graduate near the national average.
- b. **Strength**: Greater than 2% above the national average of graduation rates as indicated by the PAEA annual report.
- c. **Area of improvement:** More than 2% below the national average of graduation rates as indicated by the PAEA annual report.

**1.C. Benchmark:** The cohort attrition rate will be within 2% of the national average (PAEA annual report).

- a. **Rationale:** The KSU PA program recognizes that our attrition rate should be near the national average.
- b. **Strength:** Greater than 2% below the national average of attrition rates as indicated by the PAEA annual report over a period of three years.
- c. **Area of improvement**: More than 2% above the national average of attrition rates as indicated by the PAEA annual report.

## 2. Provide students the knowledge, skills, and competencies required for entry-level clinical practice.

**2.A. Benchmark:** First-time taker annual PANCE pass rate ≥ national average first-time taker PANCE pass rate

- a. **Rationale:** The program recognizes graduate success on the PANCE is one marker used to demonstrate students have been provided a rigorous academic experience.
- b. **Strength:** The annual first-time taker PANCE pass rates for the program are ≥ 1% higher than the national average first-time taker PANCE pass rates for 3 consecutive years.
- c. **Area of improvement**: Greater than 1% below the benchmark for a period of 3 consecutive years.

**2.B. Benchmark**: Among students who complete the didactic curriculum, the average didactic cumulative GPA per cohort will be  $\geq$  3.5.

- a. Rationale: The program requires a minimum per semester and cumulative GPA of ≥ 3.0 but recognizes that an average cohort GPA exceeding minimum standards demonstrates academic excellence among its students.
- b. **Strength:** Greater than 80% of the didactic cohort at or above a cumulative 3.5 GPA average across the didactic curriculum for 3 consecutive years.
- c. **Area of improvement:** The average didactic cumulative GPA below the benchmark of 3.5 GPA for a period of 3 consecutive years.

#### **2.C. Benchmark:** Average PAEA EOC Exam scores for each cohort ≥ the national average

- a. **Rationale:** The program recognizes student success on the PAEA EOC is one marker used to demonstrate students have been provided a rigorous academic experience.
- b. **Strength:** The PAEA EOC scores average higher than the national scores for 3 consecutive years.
- c. **Area of improvement:** The PAEA EOC scores average lower than the national scores for 3 consecutive years.

#### 3. Prepare students to provide medical care to a diverse patient population.

**3.A. Benchmark:** *Greater than 90% of students complete a minimum of one rotation in a medically underserved area.* 

- a. **Rationale:** Serving patients in medically underserved areas will provide students with exposure to diverse populations and vulnerable individuals, and promotes compassion for others.
- b. **Strength:** Greater than 95% of students complete a minimum of one rotation in a medically underserved area for 3 consecutive years.
- c. **Area of improvement:** Less than 85% of students complete a minimum of one rotation for a period of 3 consecutive years.

**3.B. Benchmark**: One hundred percent (100%) of didactic students participate in one clinical experience at a local low-income medical clinic.

- a. **Rationale**: Exposure to the homeless or non-insured populations allows our students to serve their local community.
- b. **Strength**: One hundred percent (100%) of students volunteer at a local clinic of low-income patients for a period of 3 years.
- c. **Area of improvement**: Less than 90% of students volunteer at a local clinic of low-income patients for a period of 3 years.

## 4. Encourage civic responsibility with professional and community involvement.

**4.A. Benchmark**: Each student will complete and  $\log \ge 30$  hours of community service, professional service, and/or experiential learning opportunities prior to graduation.

- a. **Rationale:** Service experiences help students learn empathy and provides opportunities to work with diverse populations; 30 hours is sufficient for experiential learning while not being an excessive burden on students.
- b. Strength: An average of  $\geq$  50 hours per student logged across a cohort for 3 consecutive years.
- c. Area of improvement: An average of less than 25 hours per student logged across a cohort for 3 consecutive years.

**4.B. Benchmark**: 100% of students will be members of the KSU PA Student Chapter and participate in at least one event a semester.

- a. **Rationale:** Participation and membership in the student chapter will reinforce the need to serve others.
- b. **Strength:** An average of 100% of students participate in the KSU PA student chapter for three consecutive years.
- c. **Area of improvement:** An average of less than 90% of students participate in the KSU PA student chapter for three consecutive years.

## 5. Strive for and encourage graduates to obtain their first job in the state of Kansas.

5.A. **Benchmark**: Greater than 30% of the graduates of KSU PA will obtain their first job in the state of Kansas.

- a. Rationale: It is important to have students who meet the needs of the state of Kansas as most of the state is medically underserved. As the first Land-Grant University in the United States, the connection of Kansas State University and the State of Kansas is foundational to who we are. The University mission states, "develop a highly skilled and educated citizenry necessary to advancing the wellbeing of Kansas."
- b. **Strength**: Greater than 50% of the graduates of KSU PA will obtain their first job in the state of Kansas based on a three-year average.
- c. Area of improvement: Less than 20% of graduates obtain their first job in the state of Kansas based on a three-year average.

**5.B. Benchmark:**  $\geq$  90% of students complete a minimum of one rotation in a medically underserved area in Kansas.

- a. **Rationale:** Serving patients in medically underserved areas will provide students with exposure to diverse populations and vulnerable individuals and promotes compassion for others. We selected 90% since we want as many students as possible to have this experience, however, given the limitations of preceptor availability and scheduling constraints, it may not be feasible to reach 100% participation.
- b. **Strength:** Greater than 95% of students complete a minimum of one rotation in a Kansas medically underserved area for 3 consecutive years.
- c. **Area of improvement:** Less than 85% of students complete a minimum of one rotation in a Kansas medically underserved area for 3 consecutive years.

**5.C. Benchmark:** Greater than 30% of applicants accepted to the program either currently live in Kansas or have in the past.

- a. **Rationale**: PA Students who live in Kansas or have lived in Kansas are more likely to remain in Kansas.
- b. Strength: Greater than 50% of students have lived in Kansas as a three-year average.
- c. Area of improvement: Less than 20% of students have lived in Kansas over a three-year average.

## 6. Prepare graduates to meet or exceed the national first time PANCE pass rate.

**6.A. Benchmark:** First-time, first attempt annual PANCE pass rate ≥ national average PANCE first-time, first attempt pass rate

- a. **Rationale:** The program recognizes graduate success on the PANCE is one marker used to demonstrate students have been provided a rigorous academic experience.
- b. Strength: For 3 consecutive years the annual first-time, first attempt taker PANCE pass rates for the program are ≥ 2% higher than the national average first-time, first attempt taker PANCE pass rates.
- a. Area of improvement: For 3 consecutive years the annual first-time, first attempt taker PANCE pass rates for the program are ≤ 2% lower than the national average first-time, first attempt taker PANCE pass rates.

## **6.B. Benchmark:** 100% of students will pass the PANCE in the first or second attempt.

- a. **Rationale:** The program recognizes graduate success on the PANCE is one marker used to demonstrate students have been provided a rigorous academic experience.
- b. Strength: For 3 consecutive years the annual PANCE pass rates for the program is 100%.
- c. **Area of improvement**: Less than 100% of students pass the PANCE in their first two attempts over three years.
