Communication sciences and disorders is the academic program that provides foundational knowledge for the professions of speech-language pathology and audiology. Students in communication sciences and disorders, CSD, explore the health and well-being of children and adults related to communication including speech, language, reading, writing and hearing. They also explore the role of swallowing for safe eating and drinking. Our faculty and staff are dedicated to student success and professional development.

A master's degree in speech-language pathology, communication sciences and disorders or a similar field, is required to work independently as a speech-language pathologist, while a doctorate degree is required to practice as an audiologist. K-State offers a competitive Master of Science in communication sciences and disorders.
