Undergraduate Secondary Major in Gerontology

Gerontology is available to all undergraduate students as a secondary major which may be taken concurrently with any primary major in any college. Must be taken with a primary major.

Requirements

- 1. GERON 315 Introduction to Gerontology
- 2. GERON 600 Seminar in Gerontology
- 3. 18 undergraduate credit hours from the list of approved gerontology electives in <u>at least three different</u> <u>departments</u>. These courses may also apply to other requirements in the student's own college such as professional or unrestricted electives. The required/elective course list is on the back of this page.

Undergraduate Secondary Major in Long-Term Care Administration

Students completing this emphasis will be eligible to take the licensing exam required for Adult Care Home Administrators in Kansas.

Requirements

- GERON 315 Intro to Gerontology, GERON 600 Seminar in Gerontology, GERON 610 Seminar in Long Term Care Administration, MANGT 420 Management Concepts, ACCTG 231 Account for Business Operations plus 6 hours of electives taken from a list of approved courses.

Masters in Gerontology/Graduate Certificate in Gerontology

Offered through the Great Plains IDEA (Interactive Distance Education Alliance), six universities collaborate to offer the coursework for the Masters or the Certificate in Gerontology. The 36-credit Gerontology Master's degree consists of eight required 3-credit hour courses and twelve credit hours of electives.
