#### C. Assessment Methods

**Direct Assessment** - Students are assessed by their committee on their culminating experience (dissertation and oral defense) using a five-level rubric: inadequate, somewhat inadequate, adequate, very good, or outstanding. See Rubric titled, *Apparel & Textiles Assessment of Graduate Experience: Thesis, Report, or Dissertation and Oral Defense, or M.S. Written Exam.* Criteria to determine if a learning outcome was met is if 70% of Ph.D. students score 4 (Very Good) or higher on the learning outcomes.

Indirect Assessment – Students' perceptions of meeting program learning outcomes by responding to an exit survey upon degree completion via Qualtrics survey tool. See *Exit Survey for Resident AT Graduate Students*. Criteria to determine if a learning outcome was met is if 50% of the students completing the survey rated learning outcomes at 4 (Agree) or higher.
