Beginner: How to find your Interior Design Internship (Migette Kaup, Professor at K-State in Interior Design; Recommended for Middle & High School students; 1st year and 2nd year students)

Starting an internship search requires strategic planning and a set of tools to communicate your interest and qualifications. This session will outline the simple yet powerful steps in planning your strategy, tracking your progress, as well as steps for developing your resume, cover letter messaging, and portfolio.

Karla and Kristin will walk you through the furniture specification process highlighting details you need to know to be successful when pulling together a Fixtures Furniture & Equipment (FF&E) specification. Karla will approach it from the hospitality design firm standpoint and Kristin from the manufacturer's side.

Advanced: How to Work in a Multi-Disciplinary Team (Gretchen Holy, Higher Education Interior Design Leader | Principal at DLR Group, Ian Kilpatrick, Design Leader | Senior Associate at DLR Group, and Jonathan Draheim, Mechanical Engineer | Senior Associate at DLR Group; Recommended for 3rd and 4th year students; professionals)

This panel discussion will focus on roles, responsibilities, engagement, and questions from the audience. In this session we will elaborate on the typical roles of interior designers, architects, and engineers. We will discuss where roles and responsibilities overlap and when it makes sense for different disciplines to engage in the process and the benefits of approaching projects in an integrated fashion.
