

PREPARING FOR NURSING SCHOOL

K-State does not offer a Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) degree. Pre-nursing students choose one of two options:

- 1) Complete only the prerequisites for nursing schools of interest to them (approximately 65 hours).
- 2) Complete a degree, incorporating prerequisites for schools of interest to them.

Pre-nursing is not a major. There is no preferred major for those who choose to complete a bachelor's degree at K-State. In addition to completing courses required by the nursing schools to which they plan to apply, scoring competitively on an entrance exam like the Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) or the Nurse Entrance Test (NET) is required by some nursing schools.

- Requirements at individual nursing schools vary.
- Students are responsible for knowing and completing the requirements of their major (if they plan to earn a bachelor's degree at K-State) and the nursing schools to which they plan to apply.
- Early and regular consultation with a health professions advisor is recommended.
