### PRE-HEALTH AT K-STATE

At K-State, we do not have "pre-health" majors. Students interested in a health career will select one of the 250 majors offered at K-State and then declare their pre-health designation. As a pre-health student, you are paired with both an academic advisor, who makes sure you are completing classes to earn your degree, and a dedicated health professions advisor, who makes sure you are meeting the requirements of your professional school as well as helping you through the application process.

One of the great things about K-State not having a "pre-health" major is that students are able to select a major that is of both interest to them but will also provide them a great educational base to build on once they enter their professional school. While occupational therapy schools have no preferred major required for admission, there are majors whose coursework aligns best to fulfill the prerequisites required for admission to occupational therapy school.

#### PREPARING FOR OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY SCHOOL

- Students must earn a bachelors degree prior to admission to occupational therapy (OT) school.
- There is no preferred major.
- In addition to earning a bachelor's degree, students must complete the courses required by the OT schools to which they plan to apply.
- Some schools require completion of the Graduate Record Exam (GRE).
- Requirements at individual OT schools vary.
- Students who complete occupational therapy school will receive a Doctor of Occupational Therapy degree.
