

PREPARING FOR OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY SCHOOL

Students must earn a bachelors degree prior to admission to occupational therapy (OT) school. Pre-occupational therapy is not a major. There is no preferred major. In addition to earning a bachelor’s degree, students must complete the courses required by the OT schools to which they plan to apply. Some schools require completion of the Graduate Record Exam (GRE).

- Requirements at individual OT schools vary.
- Students are responsible for knowing and completing the requirements of their major and the OT school they plan to apply to.
- Early and regular consultation with a health professions advisor is recommended.
