¹Note: The College of Health & Human Sciences requires a "C" or higher in "Professional Studies" courses, and the K-State 8 requirements must be met.

Up to half of the credits required for a four-year degree may be completed at an accredited two-year college**. Each student must complete at least 30 K-State resident credits to be considered for a degree from K-State. Further, the student must complete 20 of the last 30 hours of resident credit at K-State. A minimum of 45 hours must be at a course level of 300 or above.

Students must choose one of the tracks below by the time 60 hours have been completed. In addition to the listed professional electives, students may take any HMGMT course not required for their chosen track as a professional elective.

BUSINESS MINOR

Students can complete requirements for a business minor concurrent with completion of requirements for the B.S. in Hospitality Management. Following are the requirements for the business minor.

- To graduate in a K-State College other than Business Administration.
- Complete the fifteen credit hours of business courses listed. Students are responsible for meeting the prerequisites for each course.
- Students must achieve a 2.50 cumulative GPA (K-State and Transfer) in the five courses that comprise the minor. (NOTE: the HMGMT degree requires a minimum of a 'C' in the five minor courses to meet its Professional Studies requirements and the College of Business Administration will not accept a transfer grade of "D".)
- At least ***three of the five business courses*** for the business minor must be taken at Kansas State University. The College of Business Administration determines application of any transfer courses within the minor. Consult the College of Business Administration before taking transfer courses to be applied in the minor.
- Obtain and complete a minor declaration form in Business Building, Room 1001
